



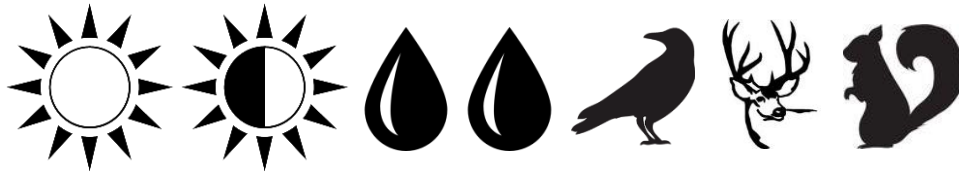
Pepper Vine

Ampelopsis arborea



This perennial vine can be found on the ground, climbing high, or growing bushy. Leaves are dark green, turning pale yellow in the fall, and may disappear entirely in the winter. Flowers are tiny and green, but produce pea-like blue-purple berries. While people are advised not to eat the berries, birds love them.

- Found in swamps, marshes, stream banks, dunes - Grows 35+ feet - Fast-growing
