



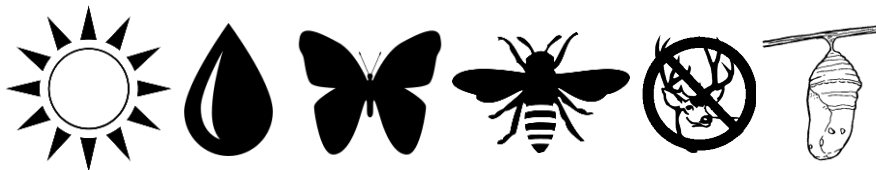
Sandhill Milkweed

Asclepias humistrata



Like other milkweeds, this species is a host plant for the Monarch and Queen butterflies. This plant sprawls along the ground and the unbranched stems can get up to two feet long. Stems are purple, continuing into the leaves. Flowers are white with a touch of lavender. Pods are long, oval, and pointed, carrying seeds that are easily blown away on the wind. Careful not to overwater this plant; it likes it sandy and dry!

- Perennial
- Grows 2 feet
- Found in pine barrens, oak woods, sand hills
