

Tall tickseed

Coreopsis tripteris



Flowers bloom atop slender, erect stems from mid to late summer into fall. Stalked, anise-scented stem leaves are tripartite (divided into three narrow lance-shaped segments). A very slender plant with thick leaves it grows well among native grasses. Grows shorter in drier sites and taller in moist sits. Butterflies and bees are attracted to this species. Birds will eat the seeds as well. Can be an aggressive self-seeder if spent blooms are not promptly deadheaded.

- Perennial - Grows 2-8 feet - Found on well drained soils
