



This grass – like its purple relative – is also a larval host for the Zabulon skipper butterfly. Old growth should be cut back in late winter to early spring to give way to spring growth. Leaves are blue-green and flowers are a fluffy white. Flowers are borne on long, graceful stalks that dance with the wind. Birds and other wildlife feed on the seeds. Plants are deer resistant.

- Perennial - Grows 3 feet - Found in flatwoods, sandhills, prairies, hammocks
