Scarlet Rosemallow Hibiscus coccineus Coastal WildSca



A good ditch plant, this plant produces red flowers with five petals, giving it its other name Red Texas Star Hibiscus. This plant thrives in boggy conditions that would kill most other plants. Leaves are palmately divided, and this often gets this plant mistaken for marijuana. Butterflies and hummingbirds love this plant. Fairly pest resistant, young plants may be nibbled by deer.
