



Beach morning-glory

Ipomoea imperati



One of two morning glories found on the beaches of the Georgia coast. An evergreen vine that can be grown as a groundcover or for beach stabilization. It grows from the dunes almost to the water's edge on beaches. The leaves are thick and succulent like and lobed unlike the *Ipomea pes-caprae*. Flowers are deep white with a yellow center and attractive to bees and butterflies. Prune regularly to in check if using in a traditional garden setting.

- Grows 20+ feet
- Found in dunes, beaches
