

October and November brings a cloud of reddish-purple cotton candy colored flowers. Also known as sweetgrass, the Gullah people of the Southeast have been known to use this plant to make their famous woven baskets. This is a plant in decline due to habitat destruction and overharvesting. While drought resistant once established, this plant grows well with regular water. A good addition to a fall garden, it is resistant to browsing by deer.

- Perennial - Grows 2-5 feet - Found in wet grasslands, sandy soils
