



Black Tupelo

Nyssa sylvatica



This tree has glossy leaves that turn bright yellow, orange, scarlet red, and purple in autumn. Limbs are slender and nearly horizontal from the base. Berries are small and blue, however plants are either male or female. A good ornamental plant, its fruit also provides sustenance to wildlife and its nectar attracts bees. A versatile plant, populations can be found anywhere in sandy soils to standing water.

- Perennial
- Grows 30-60 feet
- Found in low, wet woods; dry, sandy areas
