
Giant bristlegrass Setaria magna



A member of the grass family, this striking tall annual produces arching bottle brush like flowering/seed heads. This is a wetland species that grows best in moist to wet soils (fresh to brackish). Not for the small garden this plant needs some room to be a stand out show stopper in the fall. Birds consume the small seeds.

- Annual - Grows 6-12 feet - Found in interdune swales, near-coast marshes
