

Goldenrod

Solidago sp.



Famous for their sprays of tiny yellow flowers, goldenrod species light up gardens and roadsides. They are a critical nectar source for many pollinators. Goldenrod often gets a bad rap for the allergies that occur around the same time as its flowers; however this can be attributed to ragweed, a nondescript green bloomer that blooms at the same time. Most species will do better in full sun, but there are a few that crave partial shade. Many will spread through the use of rhizomes. Late spring pruning will give a bushier habit.

- Perennial - Grows 8 ft. - Found by roadsides, meadows, prairies
